

This graph shows which industry sectors were advanced loans.



This graph shows the purposes of the loans that were advanced.



This graph shows how many loans were advanced to women entrepreneurs, Indigenous businesses, and youth.



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


COVID-19 RESPONSE

The data below shows the Covid-19 response in loan support to businesses impacted by Covid-19.




